



ROACH SERVICE PREPARATION/POST CHECKLIST

The following steps must be taken prior to Ladybug Service's treatment for Roaches. The customer must acknowledge their preparation and cooperation as essential to help us gain control. Failure to properly prepare for treatment will only prolong the process of helping you get rid of your current pest situation. This can also result in this service being re-scheduled to an alternative service date.

Kitchen/Bath Areas:

- Before services, please clean and remove all dishes, pots, pans, utensils, etc. from cabinets, drawers, and pantries. This is to remove all dead bugs and eggs from these areas so they can be properly disposed. Items can be put back following the service
- Remove all food items from pantry and clean the areas. Cover all exposed food items with a cloth or sheet until after service. Check all boxes and containers before putting them back. Please put all free and exposed items back in concealed containers to avoid providing a food source.
- Remove all dead bugs and roaches when you see them to reduce population and spread of pest.

Other Rooms and Areas:

- Remove all pest from cabinets, drawers, and pantries.
- Cover and put away all toys, including stuffed animals, prior to treatment to avoid contamination.

All Occupants and Pets:

- Remove or put away all pets including birds and fish from your home. If fish cannot be removed completely, unplug the air pump and cover the tank with plastic wrap or damp towels during treatment. Please note that birds and exotic pets must remain out of the home for a minimum period of 3-6 hours.
- All occupants of the home should be out of the home during treatment for at least 1-2 hours afterward. Pregnant women and children under 12 months of age must vacate for 2-4 hours (**Maybe longer depending on your current health issues**).

When you return:

- Opening windows and turning on fans etc. is recommended for further ventilation
- Any cleaning should have been done prior to treatment not afterwards so that the recently applied materials are not washed away and removed.

Note: It is not unusual to still see roaches between the initial and second service. Therefore, it is very important to continue to do your part by dusting, cleaning, and de-cluttering once a week until the roaches are all dead and gone.
